TOWNSHIP OF FREEMAN ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF NOISE

Adopted: December 20, 2000

Effective: January 14, 2001

An ordinance to provide for the regulation of noise in all Zoning Districts situated in the Township of Freeman, Clare County, Michigan, pursuant to MCLA 41.181, et seq; The purpose of the Ordinance being to protect the Health, Safety, and General Welfare of persons and property in the Township of Freeman; and, to provide penalties for the violation thereof; except that nothing in the Ordinance shall be deemed to conflict with the laws of the State of Michigan which supercede Township Ordinances.

THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FREEMAN, CLARE COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

SECTION I: TITLE

This ordinance shall be known as the Township of Freeman Ordinance, for the Regulation of Noise in all Zoning Districts situated in the Township of Freeman.

SECTION II: PURPOSE

The purpose of this ordinance shall be to protect the people and the property of persons of the Township of Freeman in regards to promoting the public health, comfort, convenience, safety, welfare and prosperity and the peace and quiet of the County of Clare and its inhabitants by establishing limitations and regulations on Noise.

SECTION III: NOISE LIMITATIONS & MEASUREMENT METHOD

No operation or activity shall be carried out which causes or creates measurable noise levels exceeding the maximum sound pressure levels prescribed in the following table, in any RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL, AGRICULTURAL, MULTIPLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL, OR RECREATION/CONSERVATION District; or on, or beyond the boundary lines of any INDUSTRIAL District.

TABLE A: MAXIMUM PERMITTED SOUND PRESSURE LEVELS IN DECIBELS

SECTION III: NOISE LIMITATIONS & MEASUREMENT METHOD CONT'D

All measurements of Noise Decibels shall be determined at the property line of the complaint.

SECTION IV: SPECIFIC VIOLATIONS

The following noises and disturbances are hereby declared to be a violation of this Ordinance; provided, however, that the specification of the same is not thereby to be construed to exclude other violations of this Ordinance not specifically enumerated:

- 1) The playing of any radio, phonograph, television, or other electronic or mechanical sound producing device including any musical instrument in such a manner or with such volume as to unreasonably upset or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of other persons.
- 2) Yelling, shouting, hooting, or singing on the public streets between the hours of 10:00 o'clock p.m. and 7:00 a.m., or at any time or place so as to unreasonably upset or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of any persons in the vicinity.
- 3) The emission or creation of any excessive noise which unreasonably interferes with the operation of any school, church, hospital or court.
- 4) The keeping of any animal, bird or fowl, which emanates frequent or extended noise which shall unreasonably disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of any person in the vicinity; such as allowing or permitting any dog to bark repeatedly in an area where such barking can be clearly heard from nearby residential property.
- 5) The operation of any automobile, motorcycle, recreational vehicle and watercraft, or other vehicle so out of repair or so loaded or constructed as to cause loud and unnecessary grating, grinding, rattling, or other unreasonable noise including the noise resulting from exhaust, which is clearly audible from nearby properties and unreasonable disturbing to the quiet, comfort or repose of other persons. The modification of any noise abatement device on any motor vehicle or engine, or the failure to maintain same so that the noise emitted by such vehicle as originally manufactured shall be in violation of this section.
- 6) The use of any instrument or device for the purpose of attracting attention on the streets of the Township with the purpose of advertising, other than between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and sundown on any day, shall be in violation of this section.

SECTION IV: SPECIFIC VIOLATIONS CONT'D

Exceptions - None of the prohibitions herein before enumerated shall apply to the following:

- 1) Any police vehicle, ambulance, fire engine or emergency vehicle while engaged in necessary emergency activities.
- 2) Excavation or repair of bridges, streets or highways or other property by or on behalf of the State of Michigan, Townships within the County of Clare, or the County of Clare between sundown and 7:00 a.m. when the public welfare, safety and convenience render it impossible to perform such work during other hours.
- 3) Warning devices emitting sound for warning purposes as authorized by law.
- 4) Any activity that is a "farm operation" with the Michigan Right to Farm Act, 1980 Public Act #93, MCLA 286.471 et sec.
- 5) The erection, excavation, demolition, alteration or repair of any building or premise in any part of the Township between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. due to an urgent necessity in the interest of public or private health and safety.
- 6) Firearms discharged in a legal hunting zone or target range.

SECTION VI: ENFORCEMENT

The duty of enforcing the foregoing ordinance shall be vested in the Clare County Sheriff's Department.

SECTION VII: PENALTIES

Any person, firm, or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00, or a sentence of not more than ninety (90) days imprisonment, or both such fine and imprisonment, as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction. Each day that a violation exists, or each separate location that the violation takes place shall constitute a separate offense. The fines and penalties herein provided shall be in addition to any injunctive or other relief which may be deemed appropriate under the circumstances.
